T-TIP's primary objective is to unlock new opportunities for transatlantic trade and create an environment that encourages innovation, which will in turn generate economic and job growth on both sides of the Atlantic. At the heart of this job creation are small- and medium-sized businesses that will benefit from the elimination of tariff barriers to trade. By opening doors to trade and investment on both sides of the Atlantic we will cement high-paying, high-quality jobs for years to come. The goal is to establish more effective, less divergent regulations, consistent with our shared democratic principles which at the same time preserve standards designed to protect consumers, labor, and the environment.
